Meeting called to order by President Ron Hollerup at 2:00 P.M.

### **OLD BUSINESS**

Ron read the motion by Mary Redding: *That Dr. Excuses will not be up held if it should go against the Covenants, rules, and/or By-laws of Woodland Park.* Ron reported that he has checked with an Attorney for a ruling on this motion. The Attorney said not to take any action, on this motion, until he can do the research on it. The Attorney will let us know if we can move forward with this motion. The motion is tabled for now.

Ron reported that we have chosen Williams Accounting to do the audit that the Association voted for. The Accounting firm said that they would like to start at the beginning of our fiscal year which is October. They said that they would have the audit finished by December 1, 2008.

Ron reported on the gate system. He said that the gate system is on hold for now due to the expenses at hand. He went on to explain that although we are about \$25,000.00 in the black, for this year, we still have some up-coming bills which we need to pay. We'll still be in the black but our winter revenue is at a minimum. He added that it would be to the parks best interest to wait until next year to replace the gate system.

Ron reported that the new water panel is in and functioning at this time.

Katherine Oliver asked when the park will close. There was a discussion. The park will close on the 15<sup>th</sup> of October.

Halloween activities will be held on October 11<sup>th</sup> in Block 16.

Dean Garnett reported on the Environmental Committee. Dean also reported that Juan Rodriques, Blk. 17, Lots 12 - 15, cut trees, fixed lights, around the entrance and the Flag poll, and donated mulch to the park. Thanks Juan!

The Association would like to thank the many volunteers for their donated time and energy with this years park projects. There are too many to mention, by name, and we sure don't want to miss anyone. You know who you are, **THANK YOU!**

Angie Miller thanked the volunteers that helped her with the Craft Fair. They raised \$600.00 for the park.

## **New Business:**

Diane Halsted, Blk. 4, Lots 30 -32, inquired about what we are doing about the trees. Ron reported that there are 12 trees, in the common areas, which need to come down and that we are in the process of getting bids to remove the trees. He added that we are not removing any trees which are private property. There was a discussion.

Ron reported on what we are doing with the road grindings that the road crew gave the park.
